Event Report

Dayananda Sagar University's School of Engineering, Department of Computer Science and Engineering (Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning), organized a seminar titled "Advance Your Career with John Hopkins MS/MBA Programs" on 28th April 2025. The event was held at Lecture Hall 3, SOE, from 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM and witnessed enthusiastic participation from both students and faculty members. This seminar aimed to provide students with deep insights into the opportunities for pursuing higher studies abroad, specifically focusing on Master's and MBA programs offered by the globally renowned Johns Hopkins University.

The resource person for the seminar was Mr. Nagaraju G, Manager of Offline Marketing for the South Region at Great Learning Education Services Pvt. Ltd. With his years of experience guiding students through international academic pathways, Mr. Nagaraju delivered an insightful and engaging session. He began the seminar by introducing Johns Hopkins University, highlighting its reputation, legacy, and contributions to global education and research. The university's standing as a world leader in both research and innovation was emphasized, encouraging students to aspire toward studying at such a prestigious institution. Mr. Nagaraju then delved into the structure and offerings of various MS and MBA programs available at Johns Hopkins. He discussed in detail the various specializations, course formats (including hybrid and on-campus models), program duration, and the academic expectations from international students.

The students were especially interested in learning about the admission process, which was thoroughly explained—from documentation and application timelines to crafting a strong Statement of Purpose (SOP), submitting Letters of Recommendation (LORs), and preparing for required standardized tests like GRE, GMAT, and TOEFL. One of the key highlights of the session was the segment on scholarships and financial aid. Mr. Nagaraju spoke about the availability of merit-based scholarships for international students and shared strategies on how to effectively manage expenses while studying abroad. He emphasized that with proper planning and a strong academic profile, students can significantly ease the financial burden of international education. He also provided useful tips for budgeting and encouraged students to research and apply for external funding opportunities in addition to those offered by the university.

Another engaging part of the seminar was the discussion about student life at Johns Hopkins. Mr. Nagaraju painted a vivid picture of the dynamic campus culture, the numerous clubs and student organizations available, and the extensive support systems designed to help international students adapt to a new environment. He also highlighted the opportunities for internships and post-graduation employment, explaining how Johns Hopkins graduates often find themselves in leading roles in various industries around the world.

The session also introduced students to the role of Great Learning in supporting their study abroad journey. Mr. Nagaraju elaborated on how Great Learning collaborates with international universities to help students through application counseling, mentorship programs, and interview preparation. Real-life success stories were shared, inspiring many students to take their first steps toward pursuing international education.

The event was well-attended by students from the third and fourth years of the AI & ML specialization, as well as other branches of the Computer Science department. Faculty members, including coordinators and department heads, also participated and encouraged students to explore such global opportunities. The session concluded with an interactive Q&A, where students posed questions regarding specific programs, career prospects, visa processes, and how to build a compelling profile for top-tier universities like Johns Hopkins.

He shared examples of students who initially struggled with cultural transitions but eventually thrived, attributing their success not only to academic competence but also to resilience and community engagement. By hosting such high-impact events, the university continues to create bridges between its students and world-renowned institutions. The faculty praised the department's effort in not only introducing students to global education pathways but also offering actionable insights and support mechanisms to begin those journeys. Several students registered on the spot, seeking more detailed assessments of their eligibility and application strategies.

To encourage engagement and retention of knowledge, a feedback form was circulated at the end of the seminar. Many students commented on how the event demystified the seemingly complex process of applying to universities abroad. What once felt like an overwhelming challenge now appeared manageable, thanks to the clarity and guidance provided by the speaker. A few students expressed keen interest in joining peer-preparation groups or workshops on SOP writing and GRE preparation, which the department is now considering organizing as follow-up activities.





Fig. 6 Participants and organisers group photo


